The Initial Code: words for reading and spelling

The words included in the lists are provided as a supplement to the lists in the Sounds-Write manual.

They can be used for the purpose of word building and word reading, though they are also invaluable for giving 'quick quizzes' at the beginning of the week to remind pupils of sound-spelling correspondences covered in the previous week. In addition, they can be useful in giving 'spaced practice' exercises, in which the teacher can present words built in the morning to be read in the afternoon, or words read in the morning to be word built in the afternoon. Such 'recycling' is held by cognitive scientists to be very helpful in getting information from working memory into long-term memory.
